TRUE OR FALSE

- The top priority of the Millennium Development Goals, a United Nations project, was to promote gender equality.
FALSE - The "Goal on the 6th" entry was the eradication of extreme poverty and hunger (0.60)
- The U.N. definition of "extreme poverty" means living on less than \$2.05 per day.
TRUE (0.50)
- The U.N. wanted to see half of the people living in extreme poverty by 2015, and they were successful at the goal.
FALSE - The extreme poverty number was set from 1.9 billion to about 816 million. (1.00)
- The serious threat to improvements in global poverty cited in the episode is the looming risk of world war.
FALSE - Climate change was cited as a risk to improvements in poverty levels. (0.50)
- The greatest impact on extreme poverty in the last two decades has come from improvements to education in the developing world.
FALSE - The greatest impact has come from globalization and trade. (0.50)
- World trade has been on the increase since the end of the second World War.

- Economist Jeffrey Sachs believes that the internet has been the "single most transformative technology" when it comes to the developing world.

FALSE - Consumers are winners because they get products at a cheaper price, which leads to a higher standard of living, since consumers can purchase more overall goods. (1.00)
- Opponents of globalization regard it as an economic nightmare, putting profits before people, even though it does create employment in the nations being "colonized".

- The strongest argument against globalization is the idea that it is simply unfair.
FALSE - The strongest argument is that it is unsustainable in the long run due to the limitations of the planet in terms of resources, ability to absorb pollution, etc. (0.50)
